- CME Convention & Programs** *meets at least quarterly, via web or teleconference*
The purpose of this committee is to establish Continuing Medical Education (CME) for osteopathic physicians in the state of South Carolina. The CME Committee will annually identify the needs for CME, and plan appropriate programs to meet those needs. All CME meetings must comply with the AOA CME Accreditation Guidelines and SCOMS Bylaws.
- Legislative & Governmental Affairs** *meets at least quarterly, via web or teleconference*
The purpose of this committee is to develop a strategy for the Society's public policy agenda. The Legislative Committee develops policies for individual legislative issues that are approved by the Board of Trustees. The Legislative Committee reports activity that will affect the profession to the membership, as well as creates programs for members to respond to legislative issues. The Committee assists in educating South Carolina policy-makers about the osteopathic profession.
- Membership** *meets at least quarterly, via web or teleconference*
The Membership Committee oversees the recruitment and retention programs for the Society. The committee evaluates, proposes and promotes services for the membership.
- Nominating** *meets at least annually, via web or teleconference*
The Nominating Committee, of which the Immediate Past President is chairperson, shall prepare a slate of willing nominees to be presented at the annual General Membership Meeting. Nominations may be made from the floor if the consent of the nominee has been previously obtained. All elections shall be by secret ballot, unless said secret ballot is waived by unanimous consent of all persons present. A majority of all votes cast shall be necessary for election.
- Public Affairs** *meets at least quarterly, via web or teleconference*
The purpose of this committee is to promote South Carolina osteopathic physicians as leading patient advocates for excellence in diagnosis and medical testing through the implementation of programs that demonstrate the physicians' role in and commitment to delivering quality and accessible patient care in South Carolina. This committee shall deliver services and tools to support members in promoting themselves and their expertise, and to advance effective relationships between South Carolina DOs and their professional colleagues.
